About the Munich Security Index Special G7 Edition

The Munich Security Conference-Kekst CNC Poll was conducted online May 10th - May 22nd 2022, among a random national sample of ~1000 adult respondents in each of the G7 member nations. The total sample was comprised of 7068 individuals and the sample was drawn through panels in each of the countries maintained by an industry-leading panel provider. Data was quota'd to be nationally representative on age, gender and region. Final weighting was then applied to ensure an exact match between weighted figures and national totals for age, gender, region and education. Headline results in each country are subject to a margin of sampling error at 3.1 percentage points. Sampling, field work and data processing were conducted by Kekst CNC in line with Market Research Society guidelines. Full question wording and a detailed breakdown of the demographic and political characteristics of those who took part in the poll can be found in this appendix. The data was published in the Munich Security Brief "Zeitenwende for the G7," a project that was (partly) funded by the Press and Information Office of the Federal German Government. 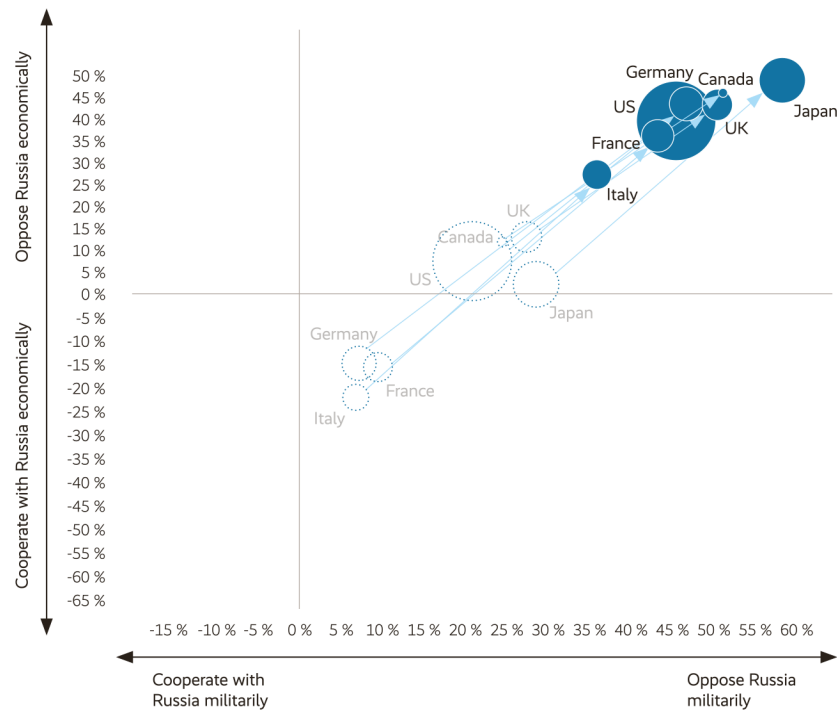
